<b>Playing Surface</b>				
Impact (Jumping, Landing)	Knees & ankles	Players	Low	Flooring as per EN 14904, Point Elastic (Type P)
Skin Burns	Knees, Thighs, Hands, Arms	Players	Low	Player can wear protection against Skin Burns, e.g. Knee pads
Floor Damage	Trip Hazard	Players	Low	Small issues with the flooring (holes, cuts) cover with Duck tape or similar.
Mud, General Dirt, Food, Beer, Glitter (items left by other venue users and pidgeon droppings)	Various	Players	Medium	The court must be cleaned before use
<b>Equipment</b>				
Volleyball Posts, Nets, Ref Stands	Injuries due to equipment	Players	Low	All equipment used is VE / FIVB approved and checked weekly
Temporary Volleyball Equipment, Junior post, nets	Injuries due to equipment	Players	Low	All equipment used is provided by Torexe VC and checked before use.
Tripping over equipment	Injury to body	Players	Low	All equipment is located outside the field of play (Free Zone)
Court lines	Injury to body	Players	Low	All permanent Court Lines are painted on the floor
Temporary Court lines	Injury to body	Players	Low	Temporary use (if required) are duck tape or similar.
Volleyball Balls	Injury to body	Players	Low	All balls are VE / FIVB approved and checked weekly
<b>Weather Conditions</b>				
Rain (Leaking Roof)	Slippery Court	Players	High	Volleyball can not be played, play is stopped
Low Temperature	Various	Players	Medium	Volleyball Rules allow the sport to be played in temperatures down to 10 degree C indoors, players must dress appropriately and coaches keep an eye on all players
Heat / Humidity	Slippery Court	Players	Medium	During tournament days, Heat and Humidity can build up in the sports Hall. Organiser must regulate the air flow in the venue and open doors & Fire Exits as appropriate. As soon as the court floor becomes slippery, play must be stopped.
Sun	Sun Light in Eyes	Players	N/A	The Riverside LC does not have a sun light issues

Junior 4 A Side Volleyball	Temporary 6m nets mounted on badminton posts	Players	Low	Fixings used are cable ties and light weight bungee
Bedsheet Volleyball	Large sheeting pegged onto the net	Players	Low	Cloth pegs are used to fix the sheet, only used during Club Session.
Sitting Volleyball	Net fixed to the base of the posts or to Badminton Posts	Players	Low	Fixings used are cable ties and light weight bungee, additional court lines are Duck Tape (or similar)
Mega Volleyball	Large Beach Ball type of game for Beginners	Players	Low	No additional hazard
Glow / UV Volleyball	Recreational volleyball played under Ultraviolet Lights	Players	Low	Only used during a Club Session. All UV equipment provided within the court free zone. See attached Glow Volleyball sheet
<b>Miscellaneous</b>				
Jewellery worn during play	Caught on net	Players	Low	Players are not allowed to wear jewellery which can get caught or present a hazard of puncturing the skin
Physical contact / Going through the net	Knees & ankles	Players	Low	Non contact sport
Ball leaving the Court area	Damage to property / Injury to Officials or Spectators	Players / Public	Low	A ball can leave the field of play area in any direction. Players are warned about chasing balls into the Free Zone.
Spectators	Hit by ball	Spectators	Low	Spectator seating is provided in the balcony area
Other venue users	Injuries to players from other venue users	Players	Low	Volleyball area clearly marked, the central curtain keeps footballs and other objects off the volleyball court. Play is automatically stopped if anything lands on the volleyball court.
